DISCUSSION/INFORMATION ITEMS

A. Strategic Plan/Prioritization – Ms. Veronica Hipolito Prioritization

Ms. Veronica Hipolito began with an update on the Prioritization Project. The President's Cabinet supports the idea that this project should be completed institution wide and not within one division. In consultation with other schools who have completed the project, we have found

a need to extend the timeline in order to complete the project and allow for an appropriate and thoughtful approach.

The President's Cabinet will be working on providing clearly defined goals and objectives for the project and on updating the College mission and vision statement. Ms. Veronica Hipolito, Mr. Russ Rothamer and Ms. Jami Van Ess will be attending a conference on this project in the next couple of weeks.

The 2016-2020 Strategic Plan is in the process of being completed and will be finalized by the end of the Fall semester. At the Board's request. Ms. Hipolito presented the Board with an outline of the strategic plan to allow them time to provide input prior to the plan being finalized. The outline is a little different than in previous years in that the focus is on a smaller number of high impact objectives. This approach allows us to focus College resources and efforts to achieve the goals in the plan.

Another change for this plan was in the types of measurements used to track success in the plan. With previous measures, tracking focused on the percentage a tactic was completed. We are now using a different measurement system that will show the impact of tactics and allow us to quantify strategic gains over time. Dr. Michael Merica presented the measures that are being used in the strategic plan. These measures were:

1). Full Time Student Enrollment (FTSE) Access 2). Enrollment of Underserved Populations Access 2a). Minority 2b). Age 25+ 2c). Pell Grant 3). Alternative Delivery Access 4). College-going Access 5). 1 Yr. Success After Last Developmental Course Access 5a). Math 5b). English/Reading 6). Cost of Attendance Access Retention 7). Developmental Course Success Retention 8). College Level Course Success 9). Reaching Credit Thresholds Retention 9a). Full Time 9b). Part Time Retention 10). FA-SP Retention Retention 11). FA-FA Retention 12). Annual Degree/Certificate Completion

13). Transfer Rate

Ms. Hipolito reviewed how the District Governing Board priorities for 2015-2016 align with the objectives and goals for the strategic plan. The priorities have all been addressed in the plan.

14). Transfer Rate after CCC Completion

The strategic plan is currently being vetted with the College community. The next steps in the process will be to vet the plan to the President's Advisory Councils, gather additional employee input, and review the plan with other experts outside the College. We will bring the plan back to the Board at the October work session and will also bring recommendations for goals we would set on an annual basis for the plan. These goals will reflect sustainable growth and change so the percentage goals may be small but will be significant to the institution over the next five years. The Board will be approving the plan at the November board meeting.

B. Wage and Employment Data – Dr. Michael Merica

Dr. Michael Merica gave a follow up presentation to his presentation at the July 28, 2015 Work Session. The follow up presentation was prompted by the Board's request to know more about details in that presentation related to county wage and employment data. Dr. Merica provided additional information on the data. See the September 22, 2015 documents file for details on the slide and additional data.
