### B. Course Goals:

To provide students with further understanding of the basic structures of German through reading, writing, speaking and listening.

### C. Course Outcomes:

Outcomes are consistent with those identified in the four skills of reading, w Student Outcomes list hing by the American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages (ACTFL) at the intermediate-low and intermediate-mid levels, Students will:

- 1. interpret written German from texts that are linguistically non-complex.
- 2. create statements or questions in writing within the scope of limited language experience.
- 3. initiate and respond verbally to uncomplicated, basic communicative tasks and social situations.
- 4. demonstrate comprehension of sentence-length statements or questions in a limited number of content areas.
- 5. recognize non-verbal cultural norms.
- 6. describe the cultural practices and characteristics of the areas where German is spoken.

# D. <u>Assessment of Course Outcomes:</u>

### Will include:

- 1. Written and oral exams.
- 2. Instructor critique of student's speaking and listening skills using a proficiency rubric.
- 3. Minnesota Language Proficiency Exam (MLPA), Reading Level 1 exam.

## E. <u>Course Content:</u>

### Will include:

- 1. The course will cover the following tenses: past tense (irregular, stem-changing verbs), formal commands
- 1. Indirect and direct object pronouns
- 2. Reflexive verbs and pronouns
- 3. Past experiences, past events, and childhood experiences
- 4. The culture of Germany.
- 5. Youth, family and relatives
- 6. Giving simple commands.
- 7. Writing, reading, and listening comprehension proficiency activities.
