The Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021 temporarily expanded student eligibility for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) through the end of the public health emergency. With these **NEW TEMPORARY** exemptions in place, students may be eligible for Nutrition Assistance (NA) if they meet the following qualifications **AND** all other SNAP eligibility requirements.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- 1** 18-49 years old
- 2** Enrolled at least half-time
- 3** Meet the income requirements
- 4** Applied for financial aid, and
- 5** Either:
 - a** Eligible to participate in a state or federally financed work-study program **OR**
 - b** Have an Expected Family Contribution of \$0

NOTE: The new federal exemptions require only that students are ELIGIBLE for a work-study program; THEY DO NOT REQUIRE ACTUAL PARTICIPATION.
