# Coconino Community College 3 Week Certified Nursing Assistant Certificate Program

The Certified Nursing Assistant's role as taught at CCC will focus on the adult population, which covers the basic concepts required to become a member of the health care team in long-term and acute care settings. Topics to be taught include (but are not limited to) an understanding of activities of daily living, communication, basic nutrition, basic emergency care, principles of infection control, medical terminology, resident safety, and ethical/legal aspects of health care. These courses will prepare students to take the knowledge and skills examinations for the Arizona State board of Nursing (AZBN) and apply for a CNA or LNA license. The 3-week course is an intense program, requiring 40 hours/week of class time for the entire three weeks. It is not recommended that you work a job during this time.

As part of the licensing process for licenses through AZBN, a background check with AZBN (only for LNA), and proof of legal presence (for CNA and LNA) are required. Furthermore, if a person has been convicted of a felony, the person is not eligible to apply for licensure or certification with the AZ Board of Nursing until 3 years after the "absolute discharge" of the sentence. ## CCC's Certified Nursing Assistant Certificate Program consists of the following courses:

NUR 110, Nursing Assistant I, 120 hours of classroom and skills labs, 4 credits (letter grade), in-person NUR 111, Nursing Assistant Clinical, 40 hours of clinical, 1 credit (letter grade), in-person AHS 131, Medical Terminology I, online

Black scrubs are required to be worn for all classroom, skills lab and clinical times. Attendance on the first day of class is mandatory.

#### **Documents Required**

All documents should be uploaded to the <u>Nursing/CNA Application Form</u> or brought to the 4<sup>th</sup> street registration desk. Documents will be reviewed by the nursing department, and if they satisfy the requirements listed below, then an override will be provided to allow the student to register.

#### **Non-Academic Records**

- 1. Current American Heart Association (AHA) BLS Provider CPR certification card\*
  - a. The AHA BLS Provider CPR is the only acceptable CPR certification. Anything that is not an AHA BLS Provider card will not be accepted.
- 2. Evidence of a negative TB skin test or IGRA blood test that is current (TB tests expire 1 year from the date it was read)\*
  - a. TB skin test report must include the following information: 1) date the skin test was placed, 2) date the skin test was read (48-72 hours after placement), 3) number of mm of induration, and 4) whether read as "negative" or "positive")
- 3. Arizona DPS Level 1 Fingerprint Clearance card (non-IVP)\*
  - a. To obtain a fingerprint clearance card, visit the Arizona DPS website
- 4. Tdap within the past 10 years\*
  - a. A Td or DTaP is not accepted
- 5. Proof of 2 Varicella (chicken pox) vaccines or positive titer read by a healthcare provider
- 6. Proof of 2 MMR (Measles, Mumps, Rubella) vaccines or positive titer read by a healthcare provider
- 7. Proof of COVID vaccine (2 doses of Moderna and Pfizer, 1 dose of Johnson & Johnson, or 1 dose of bivalent-- boosters not required)
- 8. Flu shot for the current flu season (flu season is August 15 April 30)
- 9. Government Issued ID card (driver's license)
- 10. 10-panel Urine Drug Screen

### **Academic Records**

- 1. ENG 098, or placement test scores beyond prerequisite course
- 2. Math 088, or placement test scores beyond prerequisite course
- 3. Medical Terminology I (AHS 131) is required as a prerequisite or corequisite (if this course has already been taken with a grade of "C" or higher, provide a copy of the unofficial transcript showing your name, college, and grade earned)
