## Emergency Medical Technician Program

**Course: EMS 131 Emergency Medical Technician, 8 credit hours (letter grade)**

**Course Description:** Emergency Medical Technician course using the 2009 curriculum adapted by the Arizona Department of Health Services. This course will help prepare students for the National Registry of EMTs and certification as an AZ EMT.

### Prerequisites:

- **Government issued Identification Card**-Student must be 18 years of age by the last day of class.
- Proof of a **Negative TB skin test** within 6 months prior to the beginning of class (or chest X-Ray within 2 years)
- Proof of **2 Measles, Mumps, and Rubella** (MMR) immunizations or positive blood titer verified by a physician
- **Tdap** or **DTaP** (Tetanus, Diphtheria and Pertussis) within the last 10 years  
**OR TD** (Tetanus and Diphtheria) within the last two years
- Proof of **2 Varicella** (Chicken Pox) immunizations or positive blood titer verified by a physician
- Proof of a **flu vaccine** for Fall/Spring semesters. May be delayed until start of the Fall semester.
- **Covid-19** vaccination is highly recommended for any students pursuing studies in the health care field. *This vaccination will be required if our clinical/vehicular providers adds it to their mandatory list.*
- **CPR:** Must be one of the certifications listed below and be valid through the end of the class.
  - American Heart Association - **BLS Healthcare Provider (Preferred)**
  - American Red Cross - **CPR for the Professional Rescuer**
  - ASHI - **CPR Pro**

**These vaccination requirements are subject to change at the discretion of Northern Arizona Healthcare.**

### Pre-requisite or Placement
