



## President's Information Report August and September 2018

### **AWARDS AND HONORS:**

Kyle Richardson was selected as a 2018 Coca-Cola Military Leaders of Promise Scholar and will receive a \$1,000 scholarship. The Leaders of Promise Scholarship, sponsored by the Coca-Cola Scholars Foundation, awards 200 scholarships annually – 25 of which are earmarked for Society members who are active personnel or veterans of the U.S. Military – for total awards of \$200,000. Coca-Cola Military Leaders of Promise Scholars are selected based on outstanding academic achievement and demonstrated leadership potential and were selected by a panel of independent judges from over 1,200 applicants. The Leaders of Promise Scholarship Program was launched in 2001 to assist new Phi Theta Kappa members in obtaining an associate degree and encourage participation in Society programs.

### **INTERNAL NEWS/FYI:**

The college received the Grant Award Notification (GAN) for the TRiO Student Support Services program for FY19. This is the fourth year of the grant (five-year award) and the College received an increase of 4.25%.

New student orientation was very successful with 171 new students participating in the “in-person” orientations held this summer. Online new student orientation is available to students all semester through Canvas.

The Financial Aid office has partnered with Financial Aid TV to provide instructional videos of financial aid concepts. During the first month of implementation, a total of 79 videos were watched. Our top 5 most watched videos:

### **SERVICE LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES/VOLUNTEER WORK:**

Dietrich Sauer conducted a Human Resources (HR) training program at the Shrine of the Ages center in the Grand Canyon for local employers covering Best-Place-To-Work practices on September 21, 2018. It was attended by many HR folks from the Canyon and Tusayan areas with positive feedback and a request to return again.

CCC was a proud and active sponsor of the 29<sup>th</sup> annual Flagstaff Festival of Science (FFoS). This year CCC participated by hosting nine events and facilitated hands-on activities at the Wheeler Park “Science in The Park”

festival. CCC faculty member Melinda McKinney, a FFoS board member, facilitated daily Brown Bag Lunch lectures and After School Workshops at the Fourth Street Innovation Center with over 200 children and adults participating in these events. The College also met a goal to double attendance at the CCC Science Night Celebration this year, increasing participation from 75 to 150 participants. Families participated in hands-on events led by faculty and students that included launching water rockets; interacting with reptiles, leeches, and insects; extracting DNA; and microscopic analysis of pond water organisms. Ten faculty members, three staff members and over thirty students from the Science Club, Anthropology Club and LSAMP Program made this year's events unparalleled successes.

Sarah Benton recently participated in two community events including the Native American Cultural Center's Adulting Workshop Series at NAU where Sarah provided a presentation on American Sign Language (ASL). She also served as a volunteer interpreter at the Flagstaff Peace Pole dedication to mark International Peace Day. ASL is one of six languages represented on the pole located in Heritage Square, Downtown Flagstaff.

### **SPECIAL EVENTS AND MEETINGS:**

The College hosted a Food Truck Friday Event on August 1, 2018 and despite a rainstorm, six local food truck vendors served approximately 250 community members participated. Food Truck Friday promoted the Fall 2018 start of term and the Fourth Street Innovation Center.

All incoming TRiO students participated in a summer bridge day and TRiO Orientation on August 25, 2018.

Derik Yellowhair, Student Life Coordinator and Academic Advisor, hosted the 2018 Resource Fair on August 28, 2018. This fair provided students with access to resources and services provided by the College and community groups.

The CCC Foundation, in collaboration with the Nursing and EMT departments, hosted a tour for three Del Webb Foundation Board Members. The tour included the simulation lab and construction department to show how the money donated from the Del Webb Foundation was used to support the college. It was an excellent meeting and will hopefully open the door to more funding opportunities from the Del Webb Foundation.

Scott Talboom and Kathrine Costa (Nursing Faculty) attended the Arizona Community Foundation Annual Meeting on September 24, 2018. The College received checks totaling over \$150,000 which will help the College fund a full-time nursing position and complete work on the sim lab by purchasing two new Zoll Heart monitors to assist with training Nurses, EMTs, and Paramedics.

The College hosted an All-college breakfast on August 17, 2018 which was jam packed with testimonials of how CCC, and community colleges, have shaped the lives of the people we know. It also included inspirational videos and a fun crowd sourcing activity.

The Facilities and Security Department held the first campus safety day on September 11, 2018 on the Lone Tree campus. Multiple groups from the CCC family and organizations in the Flagstaff community participated in the event. There were fire extinguisher demonstrations from the Flagstaff Fire department and other groups including Stop the Bleed, REACH, NACASA, and many others who shared information with students and staff about the importance of safety at CCC and in the community.

The College is starting its first ever Common Read program. The program focuses students and faculty on a common reading selection and can help increase student engagement and retention. For the first two years of the program, the College will use the book *Tribe* by Sebastian Junger. Several classes on campus are using the book in their Fall 2018 courses. There are Common Read community events planned for Fall 2018 including:

- A screening of a [TED Talk given by the author](#)
- The CCC Read Feast to celebrating the community's vibrant creativity and nurturing a collective sense of belonging
- The first of a two part poetry workshop with Jodie Hollander, the Museum of Northern Arizona's Poet in Residence
- A flag ceremony and veterans day recognition event
- An ED Talk focused on Tribe and the Failure to Bring our Veterans Home.

On September 22, 2018, the College participated in the Grand Canyon Career Corps program. Five students, two faculty members, Colleen Smith, and Board Chair Patty Garcia painted cabins inside Grand Canyon National Park to celebrate National Public Lands Day. CCC students and staff worked side by side with Arizona Conservation Corp and AmeriCorps members, saving the National Park Service \$37,000 in labor costs to paint six historic cabins. The day also included a personal visit from the Secretary of the Interior and member of the President's Cabinet, Ryan Zinke. It was a gorgeous day and the students had a fantastic time volunteering and learning about the Grand Canyon. The second weekend of work begins Friday October 12, 2018 where students will be working with the Wildland Fire Crew. There is still open space if you would like to join!

The College hosted New Faculty Orientation for five full-time and thirteen part time faculty members the week of August 13, 2018. The part time faculty orientation sessions were recorded and can be viewed in the Faculty 4-11 Canvas Course. These sessions ranged from an institution overview to classroom management and pedagogy discussions.

The College started offering a series of ED Talks in March 2018. The free, informational talks are part of CCC's ongoing efforts to get community members interested in continued learning. Topics covered in August and September included:

- Mushroom Mania, presented by Rachel Edelstein for beginner mushroom hunters and helped community members find out which mushrooms are poisonous and which ones are safe.
- Symbolism of El Camino de Santiago presented by Trevor Welker and Larry Hendricks. This talk focused on two CCC staff members who traveled to Spain to spend five days walking the 75 miles of the El Camino de Santiago.

The College sponsored the Museum of Northern Arizona's 90th Anniversary Celebration. The CCC band, Ride Along, performed and CCC provided food for the evening from the 4C's Deli on the Lone Tree Campus. Over 300 people attended the event and that College had an information table with Proposition 417 materials.

#### **PARTICIPATION IN REGIONAL, STATE, AND NATIONAL HIGHER EDUCATION ORGANIZATIONS:**

Michael Luna serves as the Membership Coordinator for the Arizona College Consortium (AZCC), a group with membership from over 30 post-secondary institutions. AZCC has scheduled a Fall 2018 tour which includes a series of college fairs in high schools throughout Arizona. A kickoff breakfast event for counselors was held at Grand Canyon University in August.

Scott Talboom, Ali Applin, Brian Harris, and Larry Hendricks attended the National Council for Marketing and Public Relations conference which was held in Flagstaff. This group is composed of marketing professionals in higher education.

#### **PARTNERSHIPS:**

Dr. Maria Hesse, ASU Vice President of Academic Partnerships, visited campus to provide an update on the CCC-ASU transfer partnership. Review of trends indicates a 33% increase in the number of CCC students transferring

to ASU since the inception of the program in 2010. The program was enhanced in 2017-2018 with an electronic sign up form and improved data sharing. Students can choose from 350+ degrees at ASU through this partnership.

Dr. Nate Southerland, Jeff Jones, Brian Francis, and Veronica Hipolito met with the Navajo Nation Gaming department to discuss paid internship opportunities with development projects near Twin Arrows on August 23, 2018.

Ali Applin represents the College on the Lunar Legacy Planning Committee. The committee is a partnership of Coconino Community College, the City of Flagstaff, Lowell Observatory, Meteor Crater, the City of Flagstaff Public Library, the USGS, Flagstaff Festival of Science, and NAU. The committee has been involved in planning the Lunar Legacy Kickoff Event; the Lunar Legacy Lecture Series that will continue into 2019; a special screening of the movie *First Man*; and many other meetings and events that are a part of the celebration of Flagstaff's scientific role in the Apollo Moon missions.
