The Teaching and Learning Center is proud to highlight CCC's participation in the Open Textbooks for Rural Arizona initiative, a project funded by the U.S. Department of Education. As part of this consortium of eight Arizona rural community colleges led by Yavapai College, CCC faculty and staff have designed 14 Open Educational Resource (OER) development projects since 2021, resulting in approximately \$120,000 in savings for our students. With one more year of funding and the potential for an extension, faculty and staff attend the OTRA Summit to learn how to further advocate for OER adoption and innovation at CCC. The team presented a session highlighting the College's progress and met with other colleges across the consortium.

The Student Leaders learned many valuable skills and insights: They learned that leadership is a shared endeavor rather than the responsibility of a single individual. They discovered the importance of providing clear instructions, even in high-pressure situations. They embraced the idea that any question can lead to meaningful conversations and that vulnerability is a key to effective communication. Moreover, they gained courage, an open mind, and an appreciation for honesty and the power of

making connections. They understand that being a leader complements rather than detracts from their academic pursuits. They've internalized the idea that mistakes and failures are growth opportunities. They've become more open, accepting of others, and committed to helping those in need, fostering greater inclusivity.

This experience motivates our Student Leaders to seek out more leadership opportunities, engage in open and courageous discussions, and actively participate in volunteer work. They are prepared to set boundaries, communicate effectively, and confidently tackle difficult conversations. Their goal is to create inclusive environments where everyone feels heard and valued.
