A. Identification:

1. Subject Area: Aerospace Studies (AES)
2. Course Number: 101
3. Course Title: Foundations of US Air Force I
4. Credit Hours: 1
5. Course Description: U.S. military defense structure, its mission and role in contemporary American society; organization and mission of the Air Force; examines the concepts of professionalism and officership as they apply to the military; basic communication skills. Students interested in a future career in the Air Force have co-requisites: AES 111 and AES 250 or Consent of Instructor. One lecture.

B. Course Goals: Upon completion of this course students will know the mission, organizational structure, and customs and courtesies of the United States Air Force (USAF). Students will have a basic understanding of the career opportunities, military pay and other benefits available upon commissioning in the USAF. Finally, students will be able to demonstrate the concepts of professionalism, officership, and most importantly the Air Force Core Values (Integrity, Service before Self, and Excellence in All We Do) required of all future leaders in the USAF.

C. Course Outcomes:

Upon completion of this course, students will:

1. identify proper classroom conduct, student assignments, attendance policy, grading criteria for class;
2. describe AFROTC mission and objectives;
3. list the standards of appearance for AFROTC cadets and importance of wearing a uniform;
4. list the Air Force core values;
5. identify proper grooming standards for AFROTC cadets;
6. list correct title for military service members;
7. describe rules for saluting, greeting, and reporting;
8. outline historical perspective of military salute;
9. describe courtesies extended to officers;
10. describe Air Force customs that should be observed;
11. outline and define the requirements of the military professions;
12. describe the concept of responsibilities of officership;
13. describe the basic note of an officer;
14. identify process and types of communication;
15. identify various career specialties, pay benefits and opportunities available to Air Force officers.
