3. Course Title: American Sign Language Literature: Narratives

4. Credit Hours: 3

- 5. Course Description: This course is a continuation of the major grammatical features of American Sign Language (ASL) to develop communicative and interactive competencies in the culture and language of the Deaf. Includes a focus on ASL literature by introducing students to ASL storytelling techniques, film analysis, story analysis, and its techniques. Also includes ASL narratives, classifiers and perspectives. Prerequisites: ASL 200 and 202 with a grade of B or better or Consent of Instructor. Three lecture. Fall, Spring.
- B. Course Goals: To provide continued development of second language fluency with special attention to cultural aspects of language use.
