5. Catalog Description:

The course examines the impact of substance use and abuse on the individual and on society. In addition the course provides a balanced account of all the aspects of this subject, interpreting its complex nature. Prerequisite: PSY 101.Three lecture.

To provide students with an overview of current drugs of choice, factors contributing to their use and abuse, and their impact on Society. Present to the student current theories and research relating to drug use; explores prevention, intervention, and treatment; and examines public policies concerning drug related issues.
